The goal of ABCD's campaign, *Defending the Achievement*, is to maintain government investment in home and community-based services, health care, and safety net services, for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities and delays.

Despite these achievements, Medicaid and other resources remain forever in governments' crosshairs. For people with IDD, Medicaid is not simply a health care program, but the system that enables them to live in the community.
